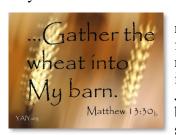

# **Pentecost Timing?**

**Q:** We celebrated Passover the sunset of April 19th. When should we start counting the *omer*? Especially, when it says "tomorrow after the Sabbath" (there's two Sabbaths after the Passover)? Some will celebrate *Shavuot* on the 9th, others on the 16th.

A: We count from the weekly Sabbath within the Days of Unleavened Bread. As you may know, Joshua 5:11-12 is often used to show we can use the weekly Sabbath outside of the 7 days of the Feast of Unleavened Bread to declare the wave sheaf within those days. However, there are a number of problems with that idea. For example, Leviticus 23:10 lists three things to be done when entering the land. 1. First they enter the land. 2. They reap its harvest. 3. They bring in a sheaf/omer of their harvest to the priests. The surface view of this looks like it was done in Joshua 5:11-12. Pretty straight forward. Or, was it? Well, it wasn't their harvest. It wasn't their planting. It doesn't say anything about harvesting (farming) the land in Joshua chapter 5. It just says they ate of what had been produced or grown in that land. We would submit that they ate of the old grain. Stored by those who fled or were overtaken in the land initially.



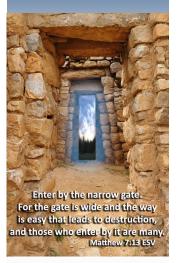
Nebraska this year had flooding which destroyed most of the crops, but the silos had grain stored from previous crops. Nevertheless, they all pretty much burst open and were destroyed too. The point is, the harvest may have already taken place in Joshua 5, but even if it hadn't, there would have been stored grains and food to take freely of. It's sort of like an army going into a foreign land and

eating whatever was in the refrigerators or cabinets within the various kitchens of the homes; better than MREs. We would also have to consider the question, "What army starts farming the land when they go in to take over the land from the people?" It's only after they took ownership did they start planting and harvesting their own crops. The *omer* is required by Yahweh from their own harvest and not someone else's.

Joshua 5:11-12 is not as clear as some make it out to be. However, the Law is clear. The weekly Sabbath within the Feast of Unleavened Bread is clear, and it is after that day the wave sheaf is to be offered. Those type of offerings were not offered until they took possession of the land and had rest from their enemies, producing offerings from their own plantings/harvests (Deut. 25:19-26:1-4). Deuteronomy was read to all the people before entering the land (Deut. 29:1; 31:1). They focused on overtaking the land, to eventually owning it and farming it. This is why we are saying June 16th, rather than June 9th.

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#### Determination of Abib...cont.

**Q:** Why do we not follow the Jews of today in observing Passover and Pentecost? Are we not to observe according to Jewish reckoning (Matt 23:1-3)?

**A:** The verse in question reads: Then spake Yahshua to the multitude, and to his disciples, saying, "The Scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat: All therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, that observe and do; but do not after their works: for they say, and do not, Matthew 23:1-3.

When the "Scribes and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat" they are reading from the *Torah* and giving the common people the Law just as did Moses. The Scribes and the Pharisees had access to the Old Testament scrolls. In that sense they sat in the seat of Moses when the people received the reading of the law.

Anciently, the people were generally illiterate, without access to books. They relied upon the educated to read to them. Therefore, reading the Law to them was necessary. We are to obey Yahweh's Word and keep His Law. We are to do as His Word says. However, we cannot blindly follow the example of Pharisaical Jews without further examining their works or deeds. Some of them love their man-made traditions that are outside the Bible or even against the Bible, while others are coming out with us and rejecting such traditions.

One can only understand what the Savior is telling us in this passage if we read the entire chapter of Matthew 23. Yahshua clearly castigates both the Scribes and Pharisees for their hypocrisy. "They say and do not!" He says in the latter part of Matthew 23:3. Notice further: For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers, Matthew 23:4.

The Savior is simply saying that when the Scribes and Phari-



sees read the law of Moses, obey it. But do not blindly follow their hypocritical example. Eight times in Matthew 23 Yahshua pronounces a woe upon them!

By erroneously considering the statements of the Pharisees to be truth, many Bible commentaries and Bible dictionaries continue to perpetuate the Pharisaical errors and disregard plain Bible statements. Truth must be sought from the Bible as closely as we can get to the original language.

Therefore, when we are told to count from the "morrow after the Sabbath," we check *Strong's Concordance* and learn that the Sabbath referred to is No. 7676, meaning the weekly Sabbath. We are to count from (beginning with) the day after the weekly Sabbath; the Sabbath within the 7 days of Unleavened Bread according to *Torah* (Lev. 23:6, 11). Sunday is the day of the wave sheaf offering. It is a day when Yahshua ascended to the heavens (the first day of His acceptance), the fiftieth day of His acceptance is the correct date for the Feast of Weeks or Pentecost.

Some continue to follow the error of the Pharisees and count *Abib* 16 as the day to begin their count of fifty days. But they are not consistent. They erroneously count from one of the High Sabbaths but neglect *Abib* 21, the second High Sabbath, and then go on counting the weekly Sabbaths. They always end up with the sixtieth day of the third month known as *Sivan* 6. Why count, if you always end up with *Sivan* 6? Maybe this is why they have a tradition of breaking down each individual day with special notations.

The proper way is to begin with Sunday and count seven full weeks, and then when the weeks be out observe the 50<sup>th</sup> day (Sunday) as the Feast of Weeks, *Also in the day of the firstfruits, when you bring a new meat offering unto Yahweh, after your weeks* [be out], *you shall have an holy convocation; you shall do no servile work*, Numbers 28:26.
