

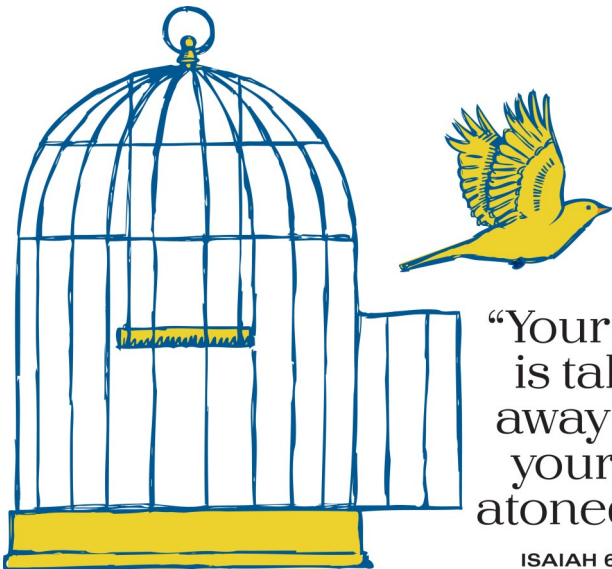

Day of Atonement

A new young believer recently wanted to learn more about Day of Atonement. Let's learn about this important Holy day. First of all, in Hebrew, Day of Atonement is known as "Yom Kippur." It is one of the fall Holy days, observed after the Feast of Trumpets.

The one thing that makes Day of Atonement different from the other Holy Days is that we are commanded to fast for twenty four hours. In the Bible, fasting means going without food and water for a set time. What does fasting do for us? Fasting is intended to "afflict our souls" and make us humble before Yahweh. It teaches us that Yahweh is our provider. It shows us that we can't rely on physical things. Yahweh is Spirit. We must worship Him in spirit and truth. Fasting helps us draw near to Yahweh. He looks at our humbleness when we are fasting. In fact, fasting is so powerful that Yahshua even said that some demons won't be cast out without fasting and prayer!

ISAIAH 6:7, NIV

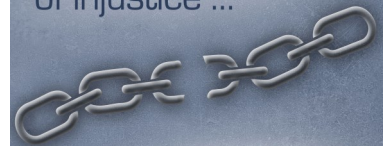
