

Are you ready for the Fall Holy Days?

Summer is almost over, and most Believers in Yahweh are preparing to keep the Fall Holy Days. In this issue, we'll take a look at the first two that occur in the autumn season, which are Feast of Trumpets and Day of Atonement.



Autumn is a very exciting time for Yahweh's people. The Feast of Trumpets, also known as Yom Teruah in the Hebrew, was a time for blowing trumpets in ancient Israel. The blowing of trumpets had many different meanings, including warning the people during times of war, and also a call to assemble the people for important instructions from Yahweh. In the New Testament, we read that Yahshua's return will be signaled by the last trumpet.

Now Day of Atonement is dif-

ferent than all the other Holy Days in the sense that we are commanded to "afflict our souls." This Holy Day is known as Yom Kippur in Hebrew. If you divide up the word "atonement," you get at-one-ment. It signifies becoming one with Yahweh. Many people have wondered about what it means to afflict our souls. Basically, it means to go with out food and water for 24 hours (known as "fasting," from sundown to sundown). On both Feast of Trumpets and Day of Atonement, no servile work is to be done.

As Yahweh's people, we gladly keep the Holy Days. They teach us valuable lessons that help us to grow in grace and knowledge. May you be blessed!


