

YAIY Quick Study Sheet

Tassels (*zsit zsis*)

G2899 *krespedon* "edge," "border," "hem," or "tassels." Note: Hebrew words often have more than one meaning. Greek words can also have more than one meaning. Different words (Hebrew and Greek) can also be used to describe similar things.

Matthew 9:21 Speaks of Yahshua having an outer garment (G2440 *himation*), which the woman desired to touch thinking she would be healed. Note: It was not the clothing, but it was the Spirit of Yahweh within which accomplished the healing. This same Spirit worked to heal others, as well (Acts 5:15; 19:12; Luke 5:17).

Matthew 14:36 Different translations say "hem" or "tassels" (G2899 *krespedon*). See also Mark 6:56 and Luke 8:44. "Hem" is more likely as His robe was seamless and woven in one piece (John 19:23). It did not have the required corners for *zsit zsis* (Numbers 15:38). However, his undergarment likely had corners (Psalm 22:18; Matthew 27:35; Mark 15:24; Luke 23:34).

Numbers 15:39-40 Reasons for tassels: **1.** to remember all the commandments. **2.** to not follow after your own heart.

Deuteronomy 6:8; 11:18 Scriptures pointed to, by rabbis, for phylacteries (*tefillin*).

Matthew 23:5 Broad and long to be noticed, both phylacteries and tassels:



Ezekiel 36:26-27 Reasons for the Spirit: **1.** to remember all the commandments. **2.** to not follow after your own heart. See also John 14:26; 16:13 and Deuteronomy 6:6-9.

Romans 2:28-29 Outward flesh vs. inward Spirit.

Romans 7:22 Concurring with the law in the inner man. See also Jeremiah 31:33.
