King David and Lessons Learned

Q. I have been reading 2 Samuel and have been intrigued by the character of King David and his life-experiences following his adultery with Bathsheba and murder of her husband, UriYah. My question is, given these sins and the manner with which he handled subsequent affairs, how could Samuel say in 1 Samuel 13:14 and Paul say in Acts 13:22 of David, that Yahweh had sought and found a man after His own heart who would fulfill all His will?

A. Thank you, for a very good question. First of all, there would be fewer narratives in Scripture that illustrate what is written for our learning and our



admonition to affirm Numbers 23:32: "Be sure your sin will find you out;" in Proverbs 28:13, "He that covereth his sin shall not prosper;" and in Galatians 6:7-8: Be not deceived; Yahweh is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting.

The 2 Samuel narrative fully lends credibility to these Scriptures. Sin's nature is that it increases to more unrighteousness. Tragically, the harvest attributable to sin, is rarely confined to the nature of that particular sin. A farmer may sow a particular seed in a field, but just like Yahshua's conclusion in the parable in Matthew 13, tares are sown among the wheat.


The farmer may never have purposed it, but then that's the nature of the fowl of the air to deposit what is corruptible in undesired places. So it is with sin. Sow corruption, and reap corruption ... commensurately greater, too, than the original planting. Also, a point worthy of notice, is that David never flourished in his effort in Chapter 11 to cover up his first sin of adultery by committing his second sin of murdering UriYah. The thirteen chapters that follow in 2 Samuel and the first two chapters in 1 Kings attest to his subsequent troubles.

So, given all that information, how is it that Yahweh sought and found in David ... and perhaps more importantly, in you and me, a man/woman after His own heart? Well, first of all, when Nathan, through his parable in 2 Samuel 12:7, declared to the king, "Thou art the man," David immediately acknowledged his sin in Verse 13, "I have sinned against Yahweh." A full treatise of his repentance is found in Psalm 51, written by him as a testimony

of his contrition. Few, however, get to repentance of their sin, and fewer still, to acknowledging their sin.

Notice also, in Chapter 12, that following the failure of his intercessory fasting and prayer to spare the life of the infant son born of his adultery, he rose from the earth, washed and anointed himself, changed his apparel, and went into the Tent of Meeting to worship Yahweh (12:20). Few, at this point would think to worship Yahweh in Spirit and in Truth, but would instead complain, "Where was Yahweh?" BUT NEVER, DOES FORGIVENESS IMPLY IMPUNITY. For like Job who lost everything to marauders and nature, he would not charge Yahweh foolishly but instead, blessed Him Who gives and takes away (see Job, Chapter 1).

Scripture Itself provides what we've found are five criteria to becoming a man/woman after Yahweh's own heart:

- Immediately repenting when confronted with your sin (Psa. 51; 2 Chr. 7:14; Isa. 55:7; Ezek. 18:21).
- Confess your sin, and trust He is faithful and just to forgive you your sin and to cleanse you from all unrighteousness, including the guilt prompted by the adversary, (1 John 1:9; Matt. 5:4).
- Worship Yahweh, even in the midst of receiving a just retribution of infirmity, necessity, or distress attributable to your sin (2 Samuel 12:20; Job 1:20-21).
- From henceforth, renounce continuing in sin and discharge the whole duty of keeping the commandments, fearing Yahweh, and working His righteousness (2 Cor. 4:2; Eccl. 12:13; Acts 10:35).
- Give Him no rest until He establish you in peace (Isa. 62:7).

May Yahweh bless you for your inquiry, and establish and strengthen you with His peace.

Ask someone how their garden is growing, and they may say, "With lots of weeds!" With Covid-19 a lot of people are starting gardens and finding out that the weeds don't make it very enjoyable. Well, there is a way to prevent that from happening.

At the Assembly, the local brethren have donated their time and some funds to have a garden without weeds. A highly UV resistant cross weave material (e.g., Dewitt 5 Weed Barrier) is recommended. If you're interested in doing this, there are videos on YouTube which give details.

The material should last about 5-7 years without needing to be replaced, and should not need to be lifted except for tilling after 2 years of growing. Keep in mind that the next Sabbatical is 2022-2023 (Atonement to Atonement).




Alms Missionary Support Fund
