

Making and keeping friends

- 5. What are your favorite Scriptures?

Handling conflict in your friendships

- D. Gang up on her with your other friends.

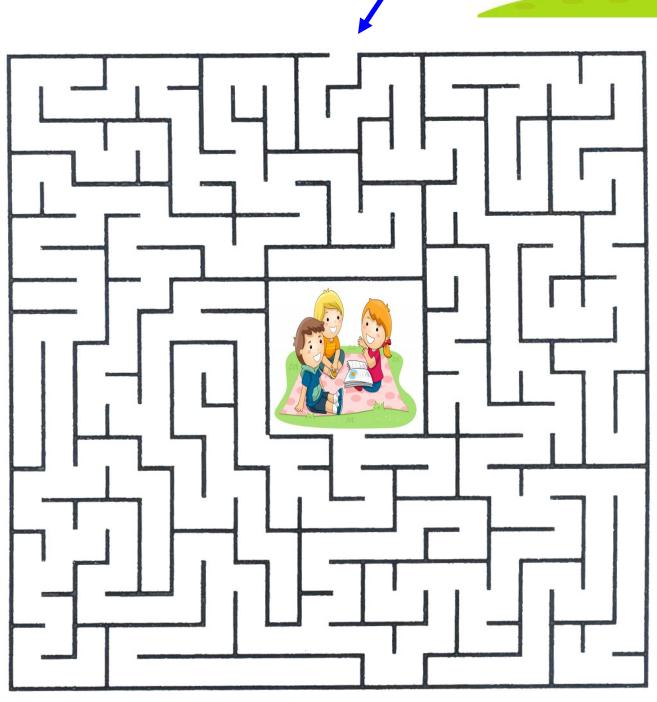

Make your own fruity-scented play-dough with Kool-Aid!

Kids, please don't try this without your parents permission and supervision. You can make your own scented play-dough right in your kitchen using Kool-Aid! Since Kool-Aid comes in so many different colors/flavors, you can have a wide range of different fruity-scented "play-dough"! All you need are the following items:

2 cups boiling water

2 1/2 cups all purpose flour

1 cup salt

3 T. vegetable oil

2 packets any flavor Kool-Aid

One large mixing bowl

One scraper spatula



Instructions: Into your mixing bowl, pour in the flour, salt, oil, and Kool-Aid. Blend gently. Pour in the boiling water and use the scraper spatula to mix it all together, scraping the sides often. Be careful, the dough will be hot. Allow to cool completely before using.
