

#### THE GOOD SAMARITAN

We are told in Scripture that we are to love our neighbors. The disciples wanted to know who exactly was their neighbor. So Yahshua told a parable about a kind man from Samaria; a man that most people of His day would consider an enemy. Here is the parable (paraphrased):

Once upon a time, a Hebrew man was traveling on a lonely road. He was attacked by a band of robbers. They took everything he had, beat him, and left him beside the road to die. Soon a priest from the temple came down this very same road. He saw the dying man on the road. Instead of helping him, the priest just ignored him and walked away. Later, a temple helper walked by. He, too, did not stop to help the poor man.



Finally, a Samaritan came down the road on his donkey. When he saw the injured man, he washed his wounds and placed him on the donkey. The Saled maritan the man to an inn and cared for him overnight. The next morning, he left money with innkeeper to

for any food or medicine that the man might need.

Yahshua asked his listeners, "Which of these men was a good neighbor?"


"The Samaritan," they answered.
