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## Feast of Tabernacles and the Eighth Day

Now that the Feast of Trumpets and Day of Atonement are past, we look forward to the final two fall Holy Days in Yahweh's calendar: Feast of Tabernacles (*Sukkot* in Hebrew) and the Eighth Day. Yahweh's people look forward to the Feast of Tabernacles all year. It is a festive time of great joy and festivities.

The thing that sets the feast of Tabernacles apart from the other Holy Days, is that we are told to dwell in "temporary dwellings" for seven days, Leviticus 23:42. A temporary dwelling is something that is not your regular home. Acceptable temporary dwellings are tents, motels, RV campers or vans, cabins, or lodge rooms. Some people even build their own structures called *sukkahs*.



After the seven days of the feast are complete, we have a special day called the Eighth Day. It is a holy convocation in which no work must be done. The Feast of Tabernacles is so special that people will even be required to keep it in the future Kingdom. In Zechariah 14:16-19, for instance, we read, *And it shall come to pass, that everyone that is left of all the nations which came against Jerusalem shall even go up from year to year to worship the King, Yahweh of Hosts, and keep the Feast of Tabernacles.*

The Eighth Day signifies, "Time out of time." This means that there are events that will happen even after the Kingdom is established. We are not told every little detail in Scripture concerning the scope of what will happen in the future. The goal of Yahweh's people is to make it in the first resurrection. Those who make it, will be priests of Yahweh. It will be our job to teach others Yahweh's Law. This includes teaching them about the true Sabbath and Holy Days. May the fall Holy Days be a blessing to you!

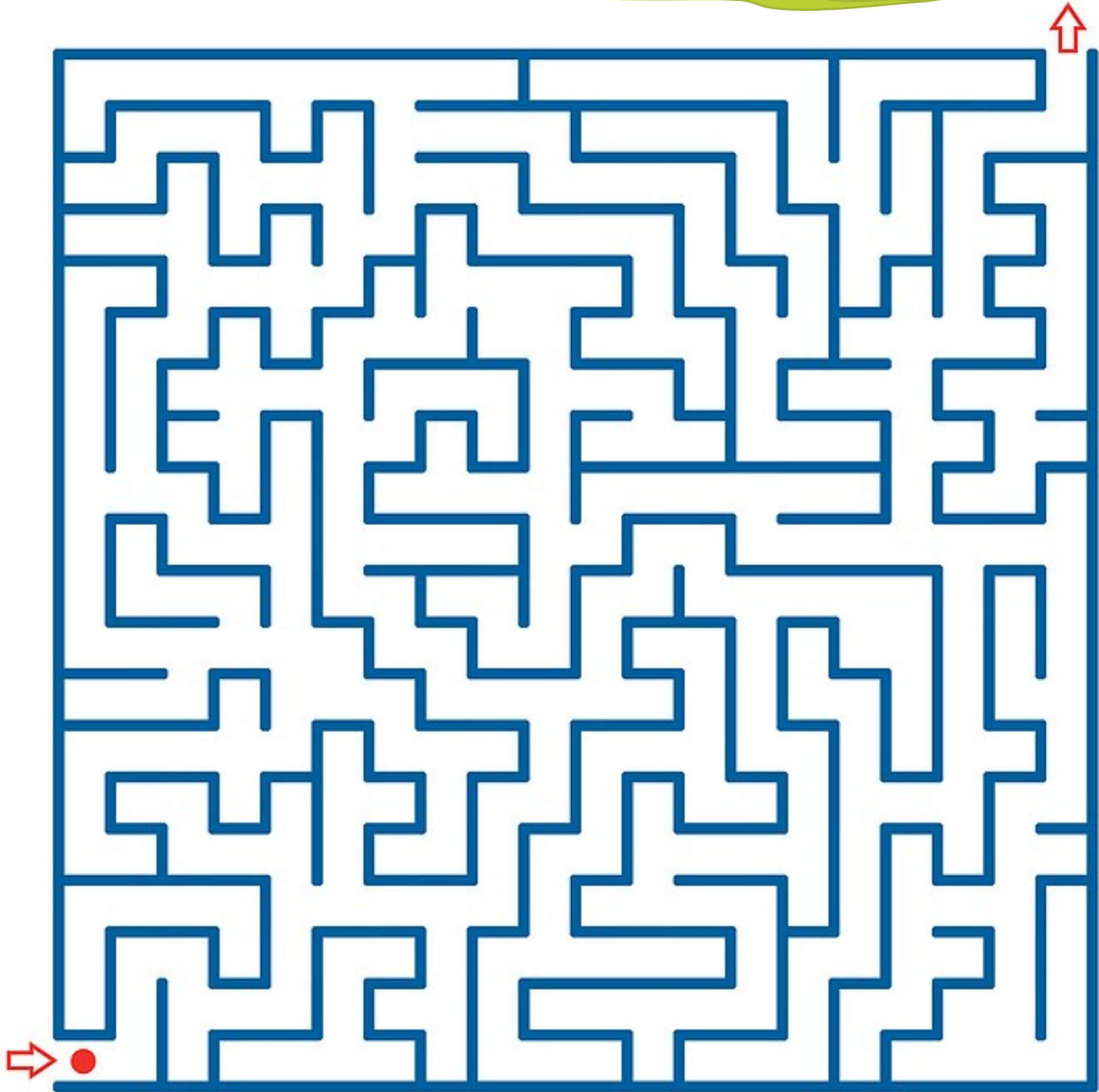
