

Wisdom in the Book of Proverbs

We can learn a lot from the book of Proverbs in the Bible. First of all, what is a "proverb"? A proverb is defined as, "a short saying stating a general truth or piece of advice." Most cultures have their own sayings or "proverbs" and the Hebrews are no exception. It is generally believed that King Solomon wrote the majority of the book of Proverbs. You may remember that he had asked Yahweh for wisdom instead of selfish desires. Yahweh was very pleased with Solomon's request. We, too, can ask Yahweh for wisdom.

So what can we learn in the book of Proverbs? If you have not yet read this important book, we encourage you to do so. Here are some things we can learn from this wisdom-filled book: making wise decisions, being obedient, having faith, avoiding evil and folly, being blessed, and having good virtues.

Good virtues, in particular, are very important to Yahweh. "Virtue" is defined as "behavior showing high moral standards." Throughout the entire Bible, we read how Yahweh intended His people to be different from the world in their behavior. He wanted a holy and righteous people for Himself.

The book of Proverbs encourages people to avoid folly. "Folly" is defined as "lack of good sense; foolishness." Our decisions have a huge impact on our lives, and the lives of those around us. Oftentimes, foolish decisions can cause much pain and suffering. Another good quality mentioned in Proverbs is being content. In the world today, contentment is not found very often. Yahweh is deeply concerned about His people being content. He gives us many blessings every day, including food, clean water, and clothing. But many people don't even recognize the blessings in their lives. We'd be wise to be grateful for what Yahweh provides for us. Even in the New Testament we find this same principle. The Apostle Paul mentioned that he had learned to be content in any situation. Let's all glean wisdom from the book of Proverbs!






