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The Passover Memorial

In the Old Testament, the Israelites were slaves in Egypt. Before Yahweh brought them out of bondage, He sent a series of plagues on the land. The final plague involved the death angel “passing over” the Israelites, hence, the reason it is called Passover. Back then, lambs were required to be sacrificed for the sins of the people.

In the New Testament, we learn that Yahshua Messiah was sent to die for our sins, and therefore became our Passover lamb. He instituted new emblems when He and the disciples were in the upper room. We read that he “broke bread” in remembrance of His Body, which was broken for us. He also poured grape juice in memory of His blood which was shed for us. It is a solemn observance, not a party.

Today, we follow Yahshua’s example each year. Baptized believers recommit themselves to Him. He also set the example of foot washing, which we also practice. Foot washing teaches us to serve one another and be humble.

Right after Passover, we observe seven days of unleavened bread. We must remove anything that contains leavening agents before the beginning of these seven days. Leaven “puffs up” food. We do this in memory of the Israelites



who left Egypt so quickly that they did not have time to leaven their bread. In addition, leaven can also represent sin. Sin “puffs up” people. We need to remove sin from our lives so that we can be “unleavened,” too!
