Start Counting!

After just completing a wonderful Passover and Feast of Unleavened Bread, we find ourselves counting to Pentecost, which will occur in June of this year. All Yahweh's Holy Days are special, but Pentecost is the only one that always occurs on a Sunday. Pentecost means "count 50" in Greek. In Hebrew, it is known as Shavuot, or Feast of Weeks.



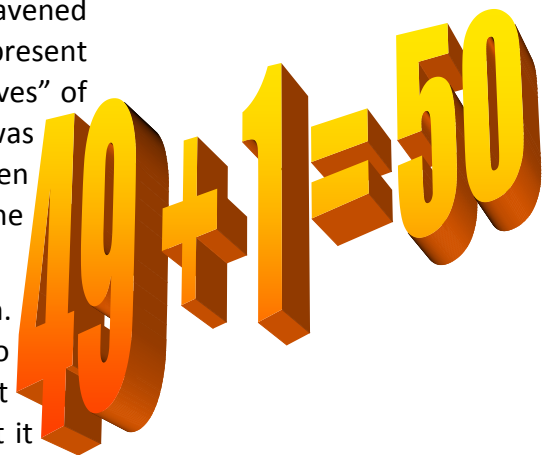
Pentecost is most known for the event that occurred in the book of Acts. The disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit. Unlike the Feast of Unleavened Bread, we are to present two "leavened loaves" of bread. The Law was also said to be given on Pentecost in the Old Testament.

Each of Yahweh's Holy Days have something unique about them. For instance, with the Feast of Unleavened Bread, we are required to avoid eating leaven for seven days. With Day of Atonement, we cannot eat at all for 24 hours. Feast of Trumpets is unique in the sense that it always falls on a New Moon. And Feast of Tabernacles is different in that we are required to dwell in temporary dwellings for 7 days. The Eighth Day is special because it occurs immediately after the Feast of Tabernacles.

We learn something from each of Yahweh's Holy Days. In short, they spell out Yahweh's plan of salvation for all mankind. We can consider them "dress rehearsals" for the future! It's important that we keep them every year. We will be blessed if we do!

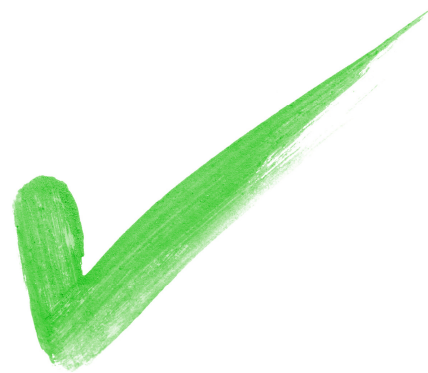

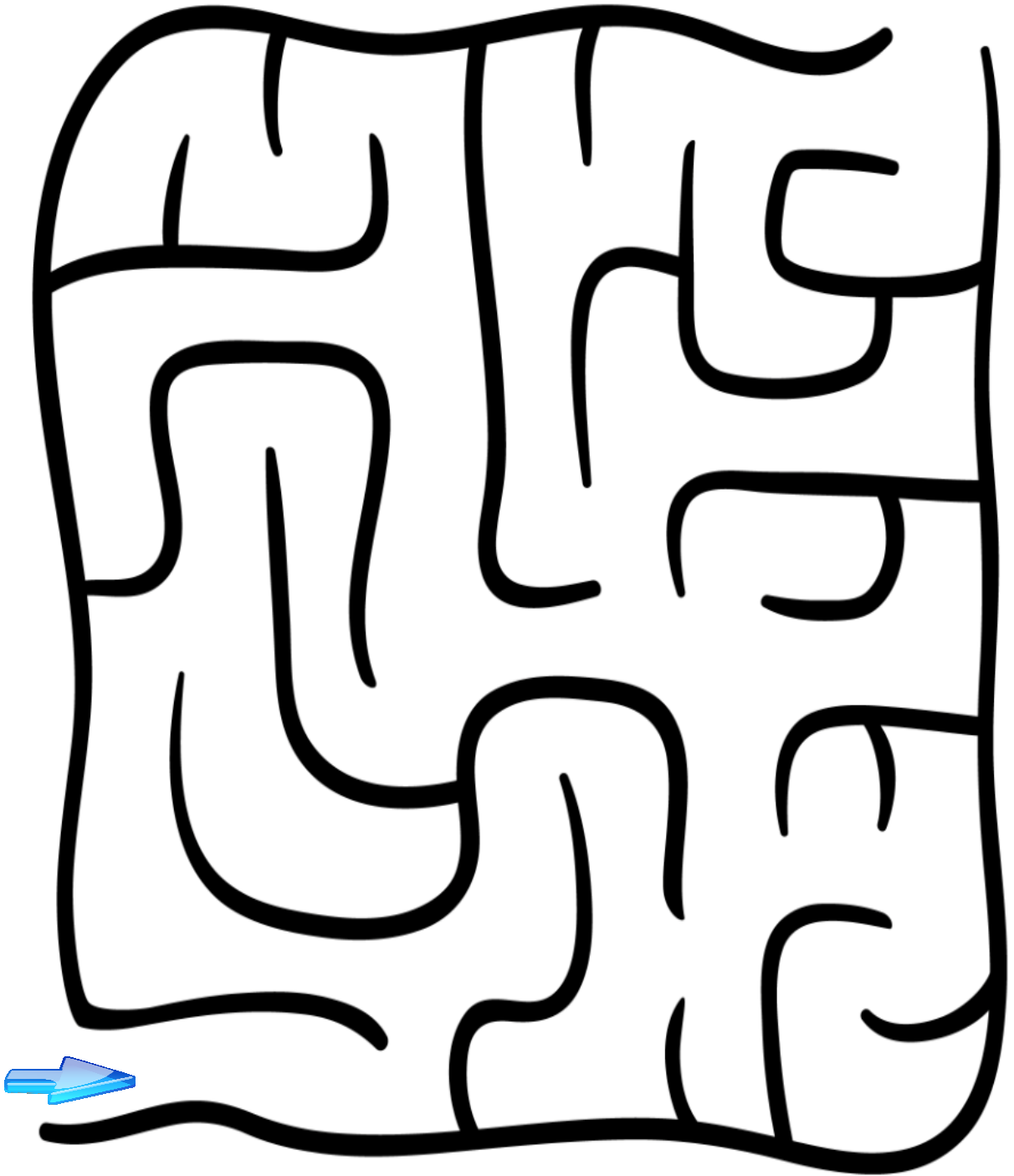
