

## Who is Your Neighbor?

In the days when Yahshua lived on the earth, the Samaritans were a despised people who were looked upon as very low class citizens. But Yahshua told a story that would shock the people of His day! He was asked a question by a man who knew the law. The man wanted to know who his neighbor was.

Yahshua said, "Once upon a time a Hebrew man was travelling to Jericho from Jeru-

salem. He was attacked by a gang of robbers. They took everything he had and beat him se-

verely, leaving him to die. Soon a priest from the temple came down the same road and saw the poor man lying in a pool of blood. The priest kept on going without even stopping to help the man! Then a Samaritan came down the road on his donkey.





# Family Fun in the Kitchen!

Mom and Dad, Autumn is a great time to go apple-picking with your children! Why not spend an afternoon together trying this yummy recipe? It's much healthier than candy, as apples are high in fiber and nutrients! Children, do not try this without your parents help.



### **Caramel Apples:**


1 1/2 Tbsp. butter

1 1/2 cups light brown sugar

6 Tbsp. water

Popsicle sticks


8 to 10 apples




Melt the butter in a saucepan. Add the sugar and water. Stir until it has a smooth consistency. Gently bring to a boil, then cover and simmer for 3 minutes until the pan's sides get steamy and the mixture is thin but somewhat sticky. Remove from the heat. Pierce the center of each apple with a popsicle stick, then swirl in the caramel syrup until coated. Place apple on a greased cookie sheet to harden. Refrigerate for at least 1 to 2 hours. Serves 8 to 10.


