And ye shall keep it a feast unto Yahweh seven days in the year. It shall be a statute for ever in your generations: ye shall celebrate it in the seventh month.

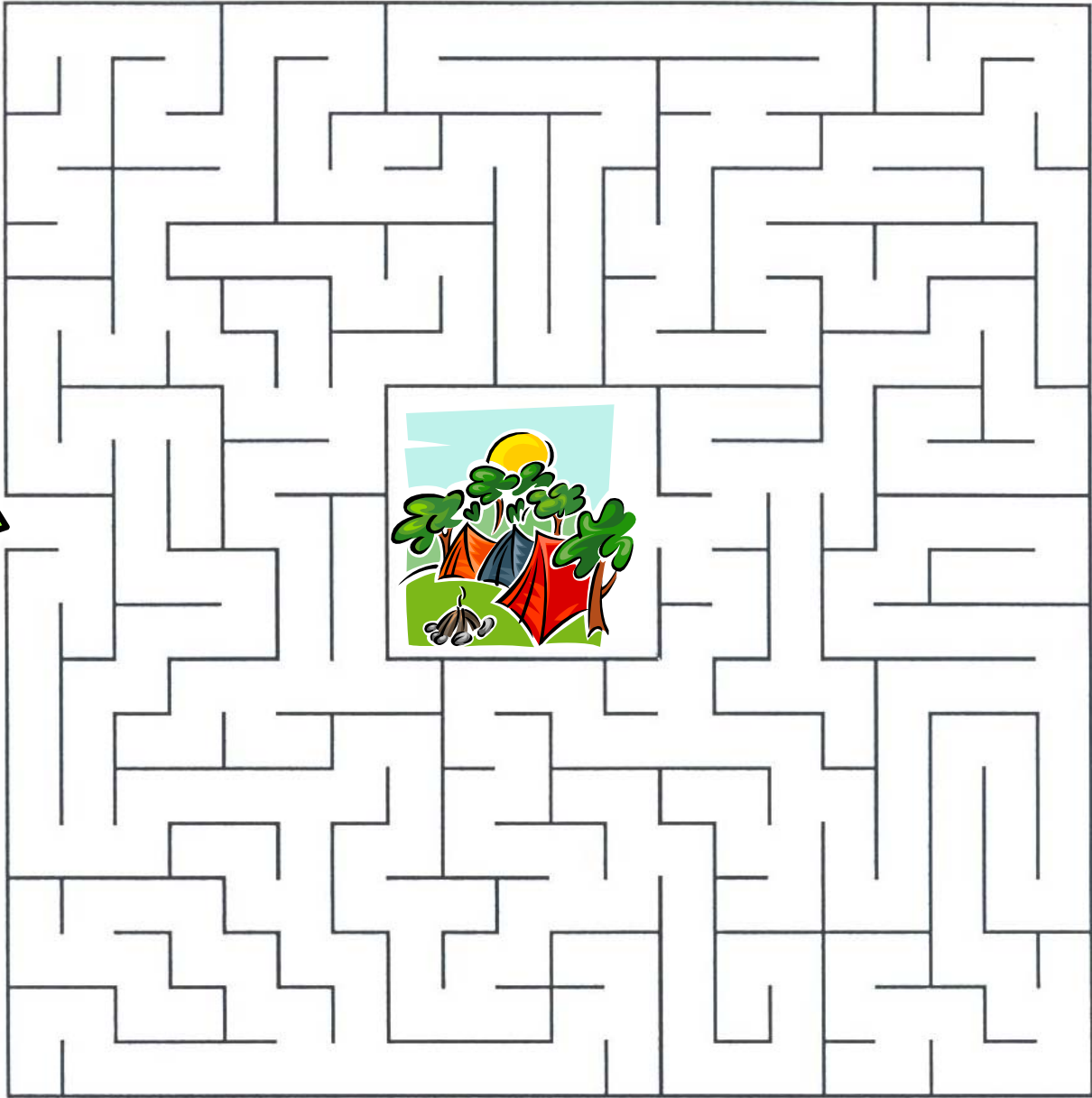

What can we learn from the Book of James?

While the book of James only contains 5 chapters, we can glean a lot of good advice for how to conduct ourselves as we go about our lives! James was one of Yahshua's brothers, a son of Mary and Joseph. At first he did not believe in Yahshua as the son of Yahweh, but eventually he did believe and became an important leader! Be sure to read the entire book of James to see what other advice he gives.

1. Be nice to all people no matter if they are rich or poor. Do not show favoritism toward those who are wealthy. Yahweh will not be pleased with partiality.
2. Watch what you say. We cannot truly love Yahweh if we curse other people.
3. If you are smart, don't brag about it. Live your life with wisdom.
4. Don't always expect your life to go according to what you want; remember that Yahweh may have different plans for you.
5. Always be honest, but do not swear by Yahweh's Name. Your "yes" or "no" is good enough.
6. Always pray to Yahweh no matter what—in good times and bad.
