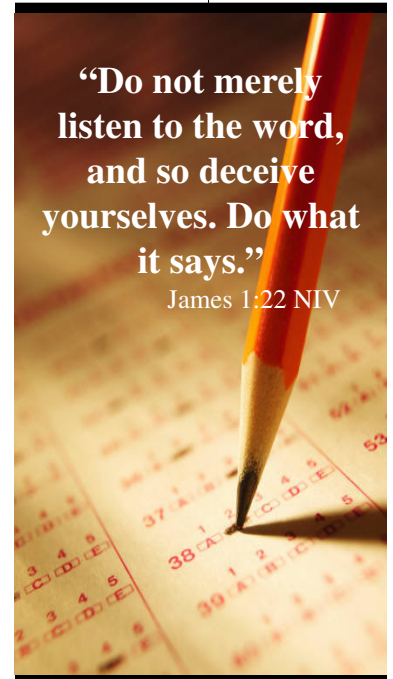

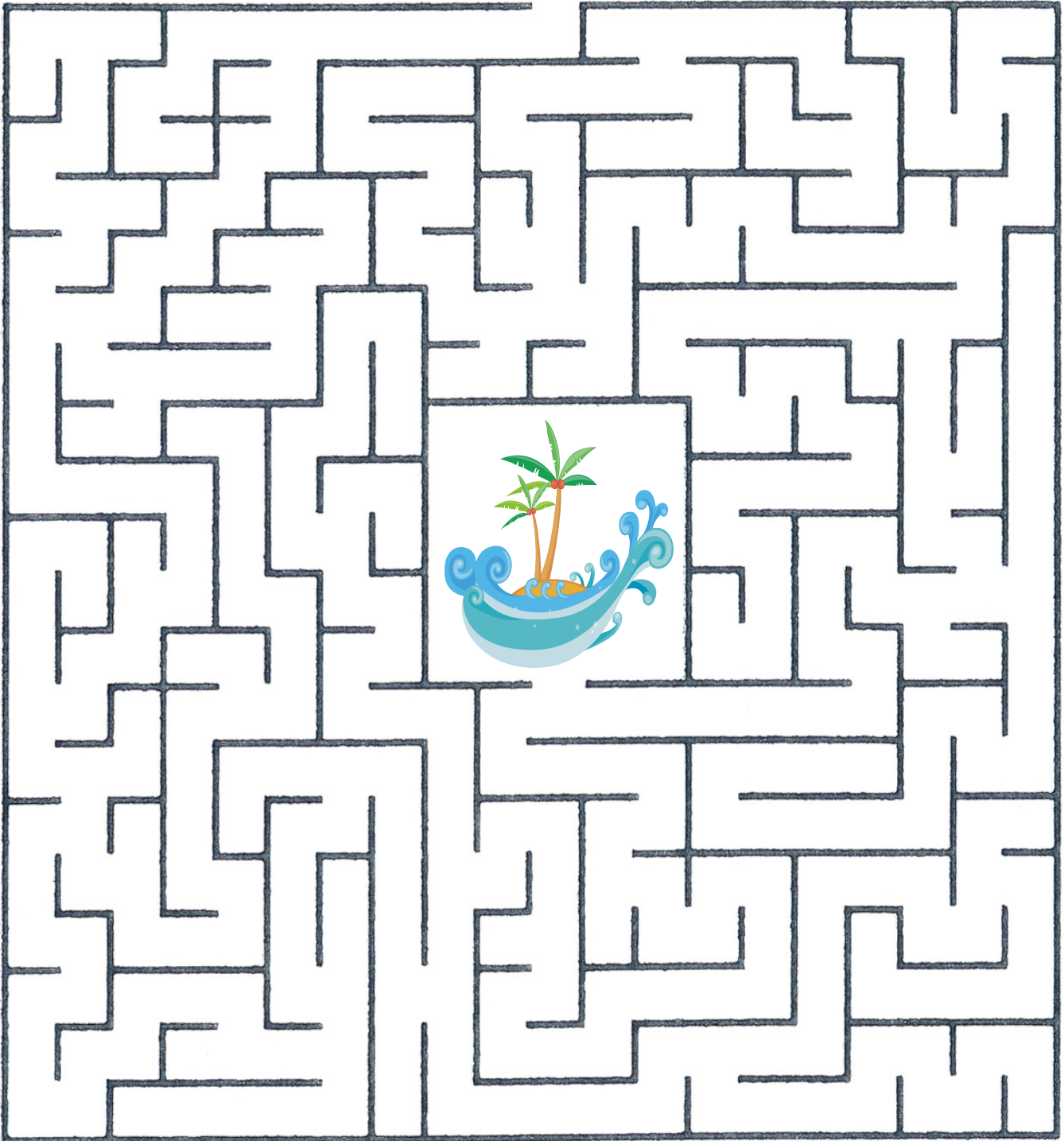

The Amazing Camel!

Here in America, camels are not as familiar to us as cows and horses are, but in the Bible lands, camels were very common. They were used as transportation and also to carry heavy burdens for the people, who generally lived in hot, dry deserts. Yahweh designed camels wonderfully! Here are some amazing facts about camels:

—Some have one humps and some have two.

—A camel is very suited to desert-living. Their mouths are so tough, that thorny cactuses won't hurt it. Camels mostly eat grass and other plants that can be found in hot, dry climates.

—Camels have an "emergency food supply." If it can't find food, its body automatically takes fat from its hump to nourish its system, and keeps it going strong.

—In fact, in famine conditions, a camel will actually use up its hump! Once the camel begins eating normally again, its hump will build back to normal.

—A camel can drink 27 gallons of water in 10 minutes. In a matter of minutes, all the water it swallowed travels to the billions of microscopic cells.

—In an 8 hour day, a camel can carry a 400 pound load for 100 miles across a desert, without stopping for a drink of water.

—A camel's feet are designed for walking on sand! Camel's feet are wide and they get even wider when stepping on sand. Each foot has two long bony toes with tough leathery skin between the soles which prevent a camel from sinking into the sand!

—Even a camel's eyelashes are designed by Yahweh to arch down over its eyes like screens that keep the sand out of its eyes! In addition, in case a grain of sand does get in its eyes, Yahweh planned for that too! A camel has inner eyelids that act as windshield wipers to wipe the sand right off its eyeballs!

Much, much, more can be said about camels. It is quite obvious that camels are highly engineered creatures designed by our loving Creator, Yahweh, not blind evolution that is being taught by misguided scientists.
