To thank is a command



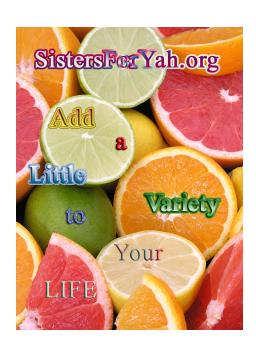

Berry Good Summer Smoothie

Make your own salad dressing!

Have you ever read the ingredients on store-bought bottled salad dressings? You might be shocked if you did. Most contain appalling amounts of sugar and sodium,. Making your own dressings is easier than you think. Since homemade dressing contain no unhealthy preservatives, plan on only making enough to

use up within a week. But those that contain vinegar will last longer, as vinegar prevents bacteria from growing. Here are some good ideas to get you started:

Italian-style dressing: Mix 1 cup of olive oil with 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar, 1/2 t. garlic powder, 1/2 t. onion powder, 1 t. Italian seasoning, 1/2 t. paprika, salt, to taste, and 1 t. grated parmesan.

Ranch-style dressing: Mix 3/4 cup sour cream, 1/2 cup milk, 1 T. lemon juice, 2 t. dried parsley, 1/2 t. salt, 1/2 t. onion powder, 1/2 t. black pepper, 1/8 t. dill, 1/8 t. garlic powder.

Thousand Island: Mix 1/2 cup mayonnaise, 2 T. ketchup, 2 T. sweet pickle relish, 2 t. finely diced red onion, 1/4 t. minced garlic, 1 t. white vinegar, 1/8 t. salt (or more to taste), and 2-3 dashes Tabasco (optional, but good for those who prefer it spicy!).

Lemon Vinaigrette: 1/4 cup olive oil, 1/4 cup lemon juice, 1/2 t. dried oregano, 2 cloves garlic, minced, 1/2 t. sugar or honey, 1/4 t. pepper, and 1/8 t. salt (or to taste).
