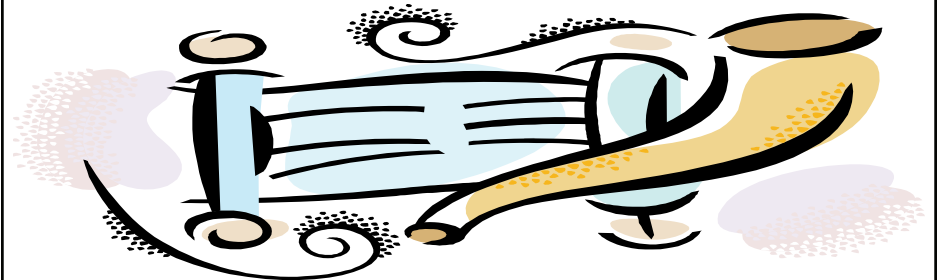

We believe that this feast will be one of the high points of the year for you. The Feast of Tabernacles is to be a festive time about which you can reminisce all year long before you are called to come together next year. If this is your first feast with us, feel free to ask questions of the elders and brethren who will be glad to help you get settled for the next eight wonderful days.



This is a special time in Yahweh's calendar when we are to gather together with others of like precious faith to worship Yahweh. It is a time during which we are to show our willingness to serve Yahweh. It is also a time during which we are to leave behind the cares of this world and concentrate on learning to be potential future rulers in the coming Kingdom. This is to be the time when we are enjoying a foretaste of Yahweh's soon coming Kingdom on earth.

The lessons one learns at the Feast of Tabernacles not only help us to understand the purpose of our physical life but they also help us to prepare for eternity. Here we must focus on spiritual goals and not physical goals. Fellowship with the brethren helps us focus on our spiritual goals.

By concentrating on attaining those spiritual goals one will find more enjoyment at the feast. The more one is involved with feast activities the more one will enjoy the feast. In attending the feast one should expect to serve others, and not to be served. Serving others at the feast will be beneficial now and in the future.

Whenever one attends the Feast of Tabernacles he is supposed to live in a temporary dwelling: a modern lodge, a motor home or a tent. By doing so one learns to live without some of the conveniences of home.

During the services we are to remember that all that we do is to be directed to Yahweh. The offerings we give are to be freewill offerings of praise and thanksgiving. The moderators are there to make sure that the services are run in an orderly fashion. Sermons, based on Yahweh's Word, are given for instruction. Keeping notes will help one remember

the important themes brought out during those messages.

Our teachings are based on our Fundamentals of Faith, which is scripturally based. If you have a different understanding of a teaching, we ask that you first discuss it with an elder and not go from person to person sowing discord, Proverbs 6:16-19.

Parents, please watch your children. The kitchen is off limits to children under 12 unless accompanied by a parent. The kitchen will be closed from 10 PM to 7 AM. Children need to be quiet between these same hours so as not to disturb those sleeping.

Each of us has talents. They should be used to build and edify the Assembly. Whatever gift one is given should be exercised. Put your talents to work. The more you do the more blessings you will receive in attending the feast and you will achieve a higher level of spiritual maturity.



Yahweh tells us in Leviticus 23:40, "You SHALL rejoice!" Get into the feast attitude by loving and caring, sharing and giving. Sing praises unto Yahweh with a purpose. Don't let the words you sing be words only. Meditate on what words you sing and on the words spoken by the speakers. Make Yahweh your total focus

during each day you spend with us. As the Feast of Tabernacles was the high point of the Israelites when they wandered in the wilderness, let the Feast of Tabernacles be your high point of the year. Enjoy the feast! Have a wonderful festive time with the brethren.



The Feast of Tabernacles is a time to fellowship with brethren of like precious faith. We usually learn that our problems are not as big as those are of some others. Our faith can be strengthened by sharing our experiences with others. By

spending a few days together at this time we are learning how it will be in Yahweh's soon coming Kingdom!

For each service it is suggested you plan to attend. There will also be a number of Bible studies. Sermons will be Bible based and Bible study topics will be based on Yahweh's Word. It is hoped that each of you will attend each service and Bible study. Attendance will assist each and every one of us to learn more about Yahweh's Word and how we should live our lives.



The feast schedule on pages 4 and 5 shows there are a number of planned meals. The furnished meal means you don't have to bring anything but yourself.



One should remember to dress appropriately when coming before the King of the Universe during services. There will be times when more leisure type clothing might be suitable such as outside activities available to do on Family Day. Remember nights are cool and days warm. Don't forget your rain gear!

It is necessary that everyone register at the main lodge. Times are noted on the schedule, pages 4 and 5. The name tag you receive at registration should be worn daily so we may get to know one another better. Make it a practice to greet each person attending the feast.
