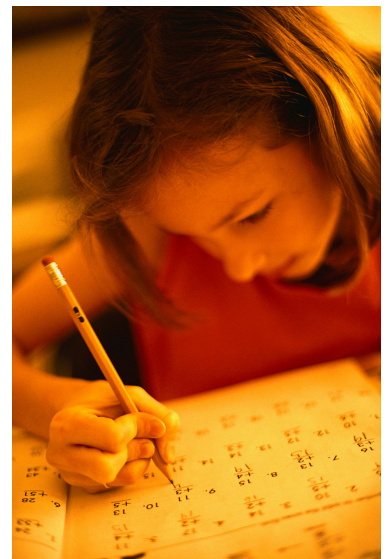
This means we really have to stop and think about our actions! So the next time you're tempted to tease your little brother or sister, pause for a minute and ask yourself, "Would I like it if some-

COOL AND FUN SUMMER IDEAS!

Summer is coming to an end, and I'm starting to hear the dreaded, "I'm bored!" Try the ideas below to stay cool. **These ideas require your parents permission and assistance.**

Make your own popsicles!

You can basically use whatever ingredients you want, such as fruit juice or pureed fresh fruit. It's a lot of fun experimenting with different ingredients! All you need are some paper cups, popsicle sticks (can be found at craft stores), and a blender. Have mom or dad help you with the blender. Here are two of my favorite "popsicle" recipes:

Watermelon Pops:

Puree in the blender 4 cups cubed watermelon. Pour into paper cups and freeze just until slightly slushy. Insert popsicle sticks and continue freezing until very solid. You can now peel away the paper cup and enjoy! So refreshing on a super hot day.



Strawberry Yogurt Pops:

Puree 2 cups fresh or frozen strawberries, 1 cup kosher plain yogurt, and 1/2 cup sugar. Pour into paper cups and freeze until slightly firm. Insert sticks, and continue freezing. Once frozen, peel away the paper cups and enjoy!

Make your own slip-and-slide



Store bought slip-and-slides can be expensive and break easily. You can make your own with items you already have, then simply throw it all away when you are finished. You can make the slide as long as you want. All you need are the following: durable large trash bags or a plastic tarp, water hose, dish soap, and an inflatable pool mattress (very inexpensive, I've seen them for \$1.99). A smooth hill is nice, but not necessary. Make sure the ground underneath is smooth and free of rocks, stones, gravel, thorns, or anything sharp. Have Mom or Dad cut both sides of the trash bag to open up into one long strip. Mix a little dish soap with water on the tarp or trash bags until it is nice and slippery. Use the pool mattress to slide across it. Be careful and have fun!
